ORDER


No.13180-HIII(5)/2020/6304
Dated 23/06/2020

Whereas the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India vide order dated 30th May, 2020 issued guidelines for phased reopening (unlock-I) of all the States/UTs Governments for strict implementation.

Whereas as per para 6 of these guidelines dated 30.05.2020 there shall be no restrictions on the Inter-State and Intra-State movement of persons and goods. However, a liberty has been given to the State/UT, based on reasons of public health and its assessment of the situation, to regulate movement of persons.

Whereas due to increasing cases of COVID 19, it is imperative to regulate the movement of persons who are coming to UT, Chandigarh from outside the Tri-city and stay for more than three days. Therefore, the following orders are issued under Section 24 of Disaster Management Act, 2005 which will come into force **WITH IMMEDIATE EFFECT** :-

1. The visitors who are coming to Chandigarh from areas outside Tri-city and staying here for more than three days shall mandatorily register themselves on Chandigarh Administration website: <http://admser.chd.nic.in/visitregis/>.
2. The visitors shall mandatorily download Arogya Setu App and shall regularly update their health status on the same.
3. There will be random screening/checking at entry points/check posts as well as railway stations and bus stands.
4. For visitors, who are visiting Chandigarh and staying as house guests or with friends/relatives etc., it shall be mandatory for the person hosting the



visitors to register their details on portal {<http://admser.chd.nic.in/visitregis/> immediately, on the same day of their arrival, if the visitors have not already done so.

5. Management of hotels/guest houses/corporate guest houses/govt. rest houses/dharamshalas etc. shall register the details of visitors from outside Chandigarh staying with them on the portal mentioned above immediately as soon as they check-in, if the visitors have not already done so. They should not be allowed accommodation unless they have downloaded Aarogya Setu Application.

6. Quarantine Norms :

a. For symptomatic persons on arrival.


- i. He/ She shall report to the nearest health facility and will be assessed for clinical severity;
- ii. On testing, if found positive, he/she will be shifted to home isolation/COVID care Centre/dedicated COVID Hospital (DCH) depending upon the severity; and
- iii. If negative, no further test/self isolation required, however self-home quarantine will be done.

b. Asymptomatic persons on arrival :

There shall be mandatory 14 days of self-home quarantine for all visitors outside Tri-city. In case of development of any symptoms, the person concerned shall inform the District Surveillance Officer of the State/ National call centre/helpline at **9779558282** for further medical treatment.


c. Exceptions :

All persons visiting Chandigarh for a period of less than 72 hours for business/business related activities, will not be subject to quarantine, on production of return journey plan.

7. Regular monitoring of the quarantined persons will be done by the District Administration, through specially constituted teams. SDMs and Incident Commanders of the concerned area in collaboration with the Chandigarh Police shall ensure strict implementation of all covid-related orders issued by Chandigarh Administration. General public and Resident welfare Associations are advised to report any non-registration of any individual(s) in their neighborhood to the police at telephone number 112.
8. Any person violating these guidelines/ protocols will be liable for action as per order bearing No.. F-2071/F-II(GMSH)/2020/7905, dated 5.6.2020 and as per provision of Section 51 of 60 of Disaster Management Act, 2005, which provides for fine and imprisonment.
9. This order will supersede all previous order issued in this regard by Chandigarh Administration. However the SOP/guidelines issued vide order No. F-2071/FII(GMSH)/2020/6183, dated 13/05/2020 for quarantine of foreign returnees amended by order bearing No.F-2071/FII(GMSH)/2020/6839, dated 27.05.2020 would remain applicable.
